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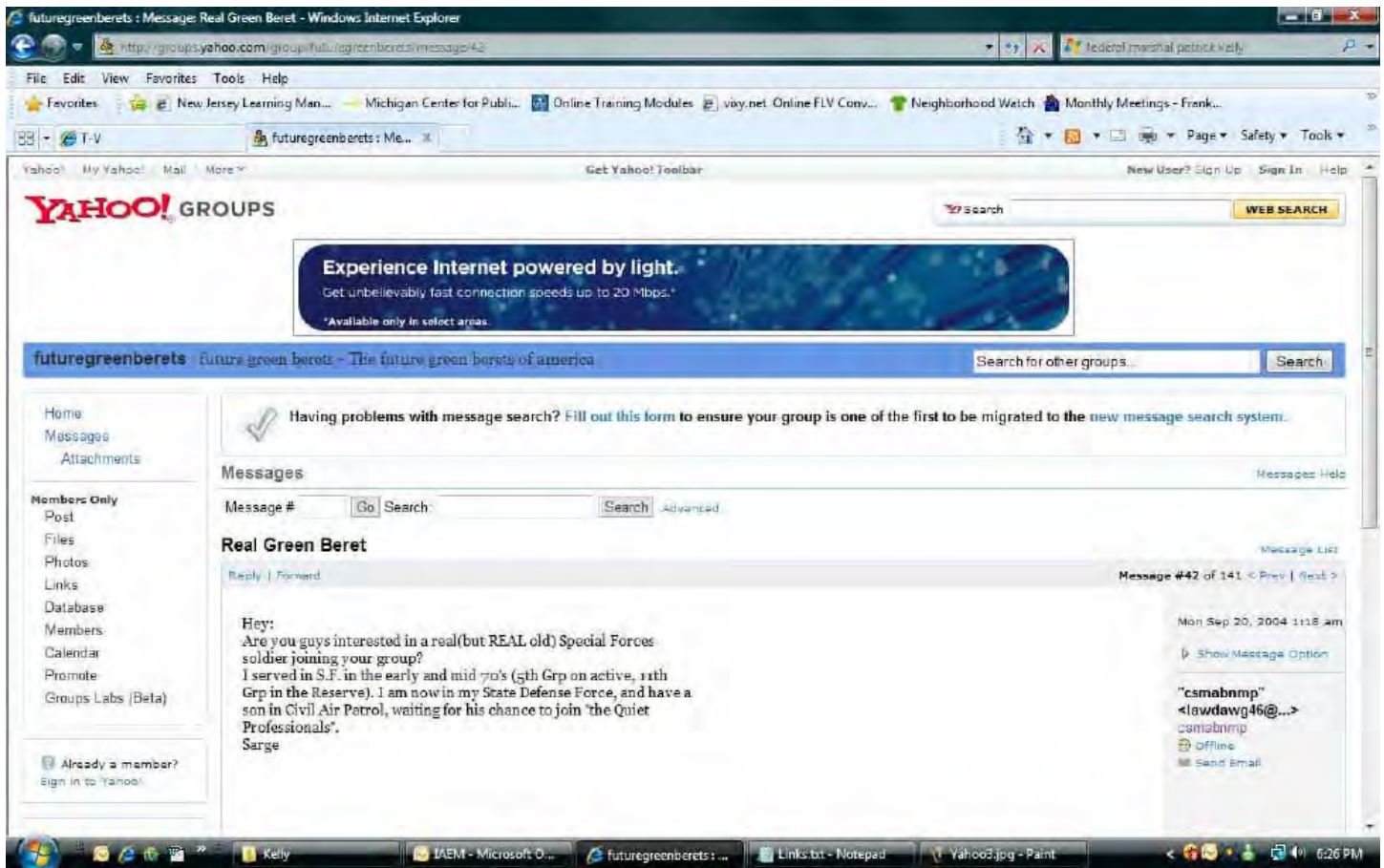

Real Green Beret

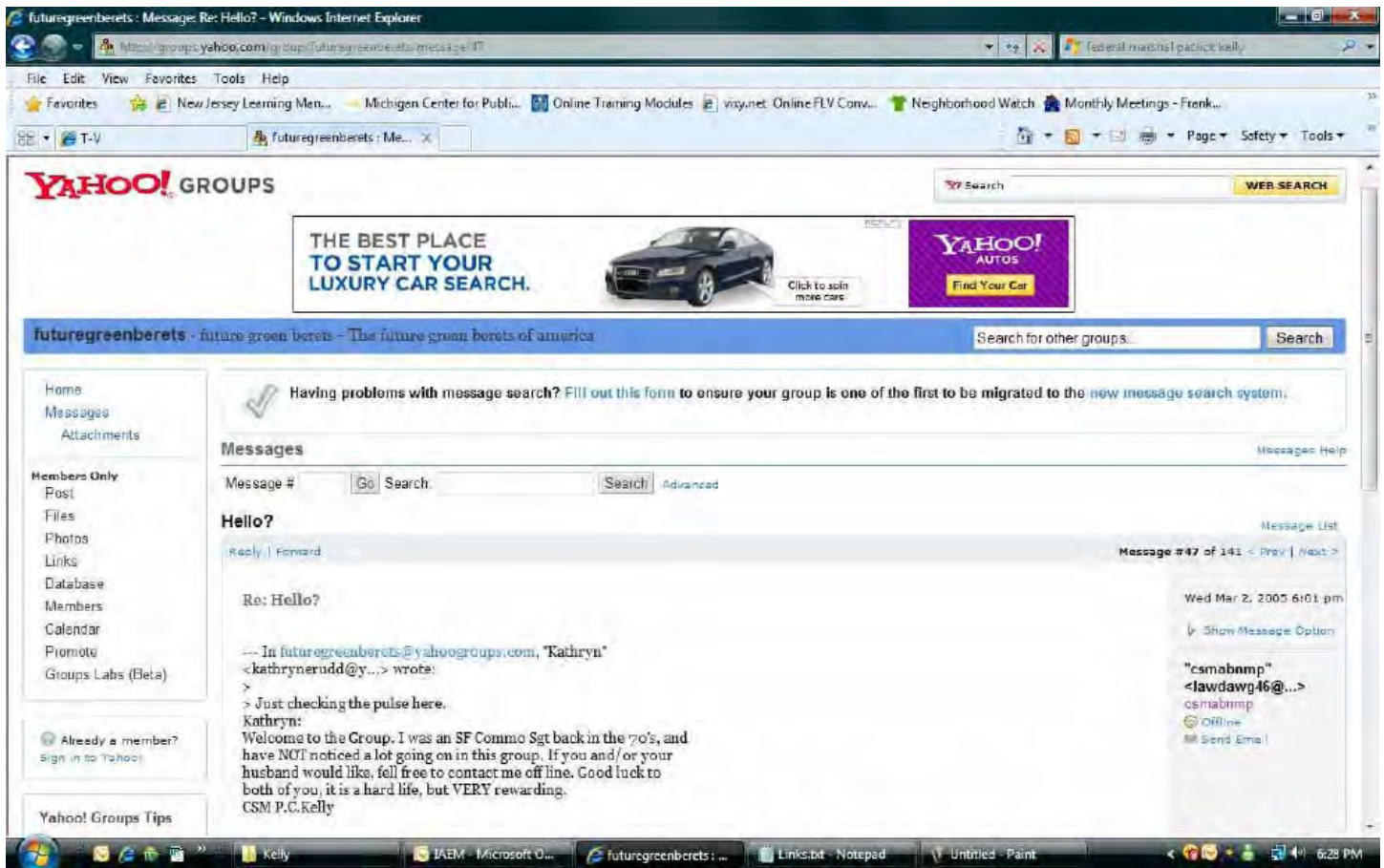

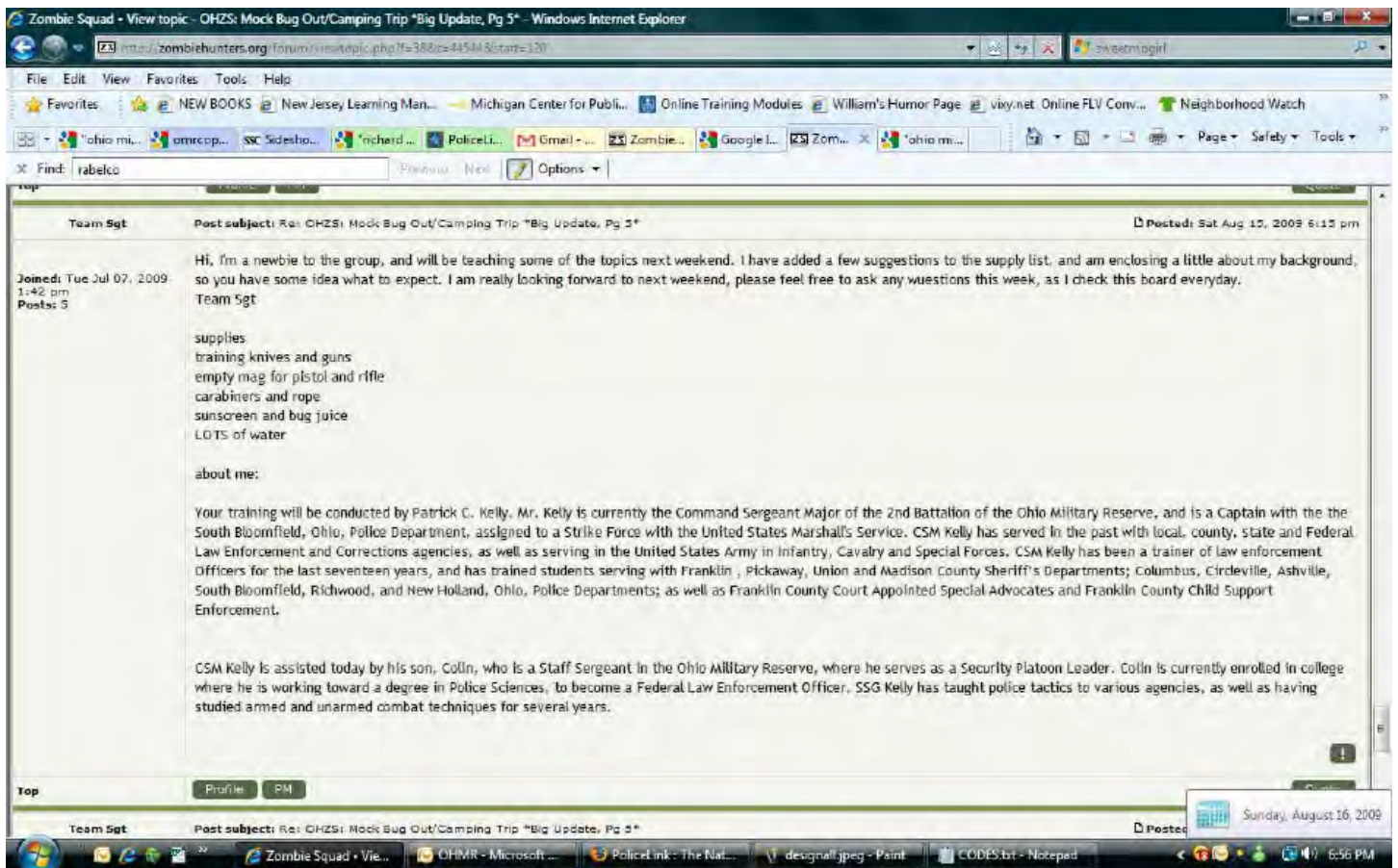

Your training will be conducted by Patrick C. Kelly.
