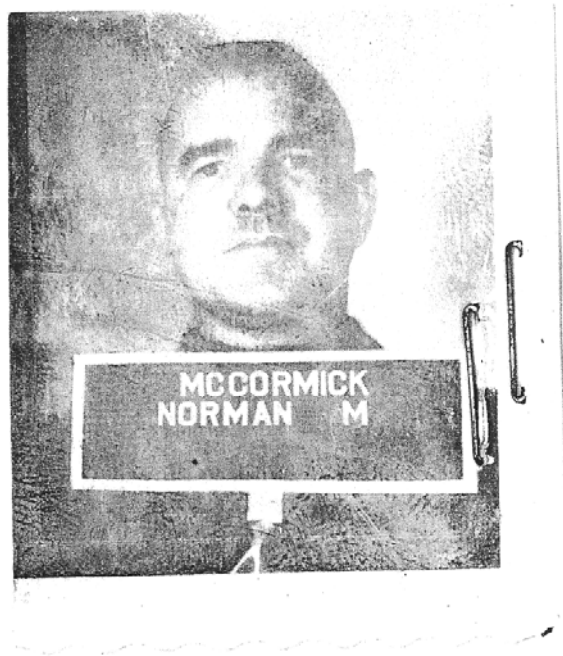

FIRST OAK LEAF CLUSTER

FIRST SERGEANT NORMAN M. MC CORMICK, 373-28-2304, UNITED STATES ARMY, is cited for outstanding, meritorious service during the period 3 December 1971 to 31 January 1972, while serving as First Sergeant, A Company, 1st Battalion, 18th Infantry, 1st Infantry Division (Mech), Fort Riley, Kansas. Throughout this period, First Sergeant McCormick's expertise, military knowledge, professional ability, and constant determination contributed significantly to the combat readiness of the unit.
