- 2. Based on the information in Staff Sergeant Erickson's case file and Memorandum for the Record INTC-WHP-wfh over 3461 dated January 9, 1976, it is recommended that the status of Staff Sergeant Erickson be changed from missing in action to killed in action, body not recovered.

## A SUMMARY OF THE INCIDENT

Staff Sergeant ERICKSON (then a Private First Class) and two other Marines were reported missing on March 16, 1968, when they failed to return from a boating trip near the Ha Dong Bridge, 15 miles south of Danang. For four days preceding their disappearance, the three Marines had been taking the boat out for a few hours each day. Shortly after the three Marines departed in the boat, three muffled explosions were heard in the direction where they were boating. A fire team was sent to search for the three Marines, but met with negative results. Another larger patrol searched along the river but could find no trace of the missing Marines. On March 21, 1968, a body of one of the Marines who was with Staff Sergeant ERICKSON was discovered floating in the river.

No information to supplement that contained in the initial investigation of disappearance, summarized above, has been derived from the intelligence debriefings of repatriated prisoners of war or from any other source concerning Staff Sergeant ERICKSON.

The exact date and place of SSGT Erickson's dath aremnot known. The following is a brief description of the facts in SSft Erickson's case including the basis for the conclusion that he is dead. On 16Mar68 SSgt Erickson (then a Private First Class) and two other Marines were using a boat for recreational purposes on a river near the Ha Dong Bridge, 15 miles south of Danang, Republic of Vietnam. Three muffled explosions were heard in the vicinity where he and two other Marines were boating. An intensive search of the area where they were boating failed to reveal any trace of the missing Marines. A later search recovered oneM Marine's body floating in the river. No information to supplement the above, which indicates that SSgt Erickson survived after 16Mar68 has been received. On the basis of the foregoing, the absence of information from all sources that he survived, and the elapse of time without indication of survival, it was determined that SSgt Erickson is dead. This finding of death was made by me as designee of the Secretary of the Navy under Title 37, U.S. Code Section 555 on 25 Feb 1976. Accordingly, continuance of Marine Corps pay and allowances under Chapter 10, Title 37, U. S. Code terminates on that date.

The proposed action concerning the subject individual has been coordinated with the PW/MIA Task Force.

This is in further reference to the change of status of your son, Staff Sergeant David W. Erickson, U. S. Harine Corps.

Although it may be difficult at a time like this to lend one's self to the completion of forms and administrative details relating to the death of a loved one, such things are necessary in settling the affairs of your son and are required at your earliest convenience.

I am enclosing an Information Booklet which explains certain rights and benefits to which you may be entitled because of your son's service. Also enclosed are five copies of the Report of Casualty which are to be utilized for any purpose requiring proof of death. The Report of Casualty is widely accepted by government agencies as well as those private and commercial institutes or agencies requiring proof of death for the purpose of settling the affairs of a deceased Marine.

In the near future an officer of the Marine Corps, representing the Commandant, will call on you and deliver applicable forms and advise and assist you in their proper completion and submission as appropriate.
